

MINOR IN ANTHROPOLOGY

Admission Requirements:

Completion of first-year requirements including either ANTH 1020E *OR* ANTH 1025F/G and one of ANTH 1026F/G or 1027A/B, with a mark of at least 60% in each.

Module – 5.0 Courses:

- (a) 1.0 course in Anthropology at the 2000 level.
- (b) 1.0 course in Anthropology at the 3000 level.
- (c) 3.0 additional courses in Anthropology at the 2200 level or above.
- (d) At least 1.0 course in two of the three major subfields of Anthropology is required:
Bioarchaeology, Sociocultural and Linguistic Anthropology.
