Course Description:

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to Linguistic Fieldwork. As such, this course will lead you into the field to seek native speaker consultants, to collect, transcribe and analyze linguistic data of a given language and to present that data in such a way that it is useful to others. We will be working with a language unfamiliar to the students, TBA. Students must complete lessons in OWL before coming to the in-person meeting on Wednesdays. After the first three weeks, the Wednesday meeting will be dedicated to data gathering and elicitation with a language consultant. This will be recorded. We will be working with a variety of digital tools and students must be prepared to spend ample time familiarizing themselves with these tools.
