- **(2) Ongoing interpretation of ancient Egyptian human remains** analyzed on-site (2008, 2009, 2010) with the Pacific Lutheran University Valley of the Kings Project (four KV tombs) headed by Dr. Donald Ryan, and with the TT65 Project of the Hungarian Archaeological Mission in Thebes (Tombs of the Nobles) headed by Dr. Tamás Bács, Eötvös Loránd University, Budapest: demographics of tomb occupants and their social, biological and health histories during Egypt's New Kingdom and later dynasties.
